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EPA Comments to Draft Final Site Management Plan

MAJOR: (potentially subject to dispute resolution)

- 1) Section 4.0, Table 4-1, page 4-2: EPA recommends that the Navy start the feasibility study (FS) after the first round of sampling. Data results from the first round should generate information from which certain technologies for remediation can be considered. If a second round of sampling is necessary, additional data/information can be obtained to facilitate the remedy and selection process.
- 2) The request for an extension for the RI/FS Report for the soils and deep aguifer was received in our office June 18, 1991. The official notification is the receipt in writing of the request for an extension. As per Federal Facility Agreement Section XV. NOTIFICATION:
- Part A. Unless otherwise specified, the following shall be sent by a registered/return-receipt mail, facsimile machine or hand delivery to Project Managers or their designated agent(s):
- 5. Any request, and response thereto, for extensions under Section XXIX (Extensions) of this Agreement.

The extension for the RI/FS Report for Hadnot Point soils and deep aquifer due August 23, 1991, has not been approved and the SMP addressing the report submission date should not have been changed until official acceptance from EPA and State of North Carolina DEHNR was received in writing.

The references to the kI/FS Report (November 1, 1991) due date for Hadnot Point Soils and Deep Aquifer should be changed to reflect the original August 23, 1991, due date. The SMP cannot be accepted until this change is made. Any extensions granted by EPA and the State will be reflected in separate correspondence and the impacts on following activities determined at that time.

3) Section 5.0, Site Numbers 16 (pg. 5-6) and 28 (pg. 5-10): The "Deliverables" date shown does not correspond with either Figure 4-4 (deliverables chart) in Section 4.0, pg. 4-8, or the Scheduled Start date.

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MINOR: (Will not be subject of dispute resolution)

1) Section 5.0, page 5-2 through 5-19: Although all information presented in this section is both applicable and appropriate, EPA recommends that the sites be listed by their "Deliverables" and not by site number. That way the "Scope of Work Summeries" for each site will move through consecutive years the same way that Section 4.0 is presented.
