Dear Col. Dalzell:

The purpose of this letter is to inform you of Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and North Carolina Hazardous Waste Branch (NCHWB) intentions to conduct a RCRA Facility Assessment (RFA) at Marine Corps Base (MCB) Camp LeJeune and Marine Corps Air Station New River during the period of January 9 through January 13, 1989. The RFA is necessary to identify RCRA obligations to be addressed by future language within an Interagency Agreement (IAG) developed for MCB Camp LeJeune. The IAG is a statutory requirement due to the fact that MCB Camp LeJeune has been proposed for the National Priorities List (NPL), as defined by the Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation, and Liability Act of 1980 (CERCLA), as amended by the Superfund Amendments and Reauthorization Act of 1986.

The design of the RFA will be to:

- Identify and gather information on Solid Waste Management Units (SWMUs);
- Make preliminary determinations regarding known or suspected releases of hazardous waste or hazardous constituents from SWMUs;
- Make determinations of the need for further actions . (RCRA Facility Investigations, interim measures, or no further action);
- identify any unresolved matters that may require additional RFA work and any RCRA non compliance issues; and

- coordinate RCRA and CERCLA activities and responsibilities.
