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GENERAL

- Many of the comments provided in the my letter of February 1992 have been incorporated into this document. Specifically, EPA concurs with the Navy's proposal for combining sites into Operable Units for the purpose of investigation and study.
- 2. The length of time proposed for the conduct of the RI/FS is excessive. This time must be reduced. It is the hope of EPA that as work progress at the facility that the overall timeframes will be reduced to demonstrate the increased proficiency and efficiency of the "team" in implementing the CERCLA process.

SPECIFIC COMMENTS

- Page 1-1, Section 1.0 The "purpose" statement should be amended to include "...during fiscal year 1993 and to provide projections for long term progress at the facility...".
- Page 1-4, Section 1.4 EPA tentatively concurs with the proposal provided in this section. Approval of the final document will constitute approval of the anticipated amendment.
- 3. Page 4-3, Table 4-2 The date of 10/20/93 for submittal of the draft work plans for sites 21, 24, and 78 is unacceptable. As agreed by all parties, these documents are to be submitted before the end of fiscal year 1992. Please adjust these schedules accordingly.

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
