Chlorinated Solvent Contaminants in Deep Aguifer, Site 6

Dear Mr. Brant:

We thank you for providing us with the preliminary results of groundwater sampling analysis from the deep monitoring wells installed at site 6. We understand that in monitoring wells 6GWlD trichloroethylene and vinyl chloride have been found at 58,000 ppb and 90 ppb respectively. Duplicate samples indicate 35,000 ppb and a "no detect" respectively. Nearby wells also show contaminants to a lesser degree.

We also understand that there is an active public water supply well approximately 2100 feet south of monitoring well 6GWlD, and recent water samples indicate the water has not been degraded.

Although your recent sampling indicates that no degradation of the supply well has occurred, the NC Superfund Section still advises you to contact Mr. Michael Bell, NC Environmental Health, Washington, NC office, (919) 946-6481, to inform him of your findings and discuss the disposition and continued use of this well.

Please update us on your progress as soon as possible.
