The North Carolina Superfund Section has received and reviewed the subject documents concerning the Interim Remedial Action for the Shallow Aquifer at the Hadnot Point Industrial Area (HPIA). The State has no additional comments at this time on these documents. It is our understanding, as discussed during the Technical Review Committee Meeting on 19 April 1992, that the necessity of the use of carbon adsorption in conjunction with air stripping will be determined during the planned treatability studies, and that the
