The Division of Environmental Management has completed the review of the subject document and offers the following comments and recommendations.

Air Quality Section Comments

This document precedes documents which require air quality review or comments.

Water Quality Section Comments

The Water Quality Section has the following comments:

The position that it is unlikely that stripped mullet would be ingested needs to be re-evaluated. This fish has significant sales in fish outlets.

As the U.S. EPA SV analysis indicates that PCB's may be of concern from a human health perspective; it would appear that a recommendation to adequately address this concern should be either included in the report or further discussion should be provided on the rationale for discounting the concern.

The Division of Environmental Health, Epidemiology section is the regulatory authority for determining fish advisory levels and consumption bans. If they have not already been asked to review the subject document, they should be given the opportunity.

The water column and sediment concentrations of the parameters (i.e. pesticides, PCB's, etc.) are not available in the subject document. The

Water Quality Section would like to review these data for Operable Unit No. 2.
