The Division of Environmental Management has completed the review of the subject document and offers the following comments and recommendations.

## Air Quality Section Comments

No comments at this time.

## Water Quality Section Comments

No comments have been received from the Water Quality Section.

## Groundwater Quality Section Comments

The consultant's answer to the question concerning the plume's possible intersection with surface waters is weak. The consultant states that there is no indication, from the monitoring network, that contaminants have migrated off site to a surface water body. The consultant should have performed modeling that showed that 2L standards would be met within one year time of travel upgradient from any receptor. This determination should be based on the travel time and natural attenuation capacity of the contaminant or on a physical barrier to groundwater migration that currently exists or will be installed.

The Director of DEM will have to approve of the limited action proposal. The Navy should propose corrective action under

 $15\mbox{A}$  NCAC  $2\mbox{L}$  .0106(1) and submit it to the Director, Division of Enviornmental Management.
