Marine Corps Base, Camp Lejeune extends its appreciation to you and the North Carolina Department of Environment, Health, and Natural Resources (DEHNR) for the support of our Installation Restoration (IR) Program. During the last two years, the IR Program has satisfied regulatory requirements, completed two Time Critical Removal Actions, signed Records of Decision (RODs) for nine sites, and is currently on schedule to sign RODs for an additional seven sites in fiscal year 1995. This will account for 18 final RODs of the 34 IR sites selected for further study in the Federal Facilities Agreement. These accomplishments would not have been possible without the guidance, support, and counsel of your office.
