COMMENTS CONCERNING THE DRAFT FINAL REMEDIAL INVESTIGATION REPORT, OPERABLE UNIT NO. 14

- 1. Page 1-3, para 3, sentence 4, and page 6-2, para 5, sentence 1 Change to read: "Access is restricted by a 6-foot high chain link fence, topped with barbed-wire, with a locked entrance gate."
- 2. Figure 1-2 Reverse the numbers identifying Sites 44 and 36. The sites are correctly shown but incorrectly labeled.
- 3. Figures 2-1, 2-2, and 2-3 These photographs are extremely difficult to distinguish and it is impossible to read the corresponding notes/labels.
- 4. Figures 2-13, 4-16, 7-3, and 7-4 Correct the label on the body of water to Stone Bay, not "Stones Bay".
- 5. Page 3-7, para 4 The first sentence implies that the Base receives all of its water from "on-base" wells. This is incorrect in that the Rifle Range area has its water provided by Onslow County. The second sentence states that there are "eight water treatment plants" for the Base. Currently the Base operates five water treatment plants.
- 6. Page 3-7, last para, third sentence Delete this sentence as it is not relevant to this document.
