Dear Ms. Landman:

The NC Superfund Section has completed its review of the referenced document and concurs with the Explanation of Significant Difference indicated for Site 21 of Operable Unit 1 subject to the following conditions.

- Since industrial based cleanup levels are to be used, the Base Master Plan should clearly indicate that Site 21 cannot be used in a residential scenario unless the area is cleaned up to the appropriate residential based levels.
- 2. This concurrence is based on the information presented in the ESD, Record of Decision, Remedial Investigation Report, Feasibility Study and the Proposed Remedial Action Plan. Should the State receive new or additional information which significantly affects this concurrence, it may be modified or withdrawn with appropriate written notice to the Navy and EPA Region IV.
- 3. Our concurrence with this ESD in no way binds the State to concur in future decisions or commits the State to participate, financially or otherwise, in the cleanup of the Site. The State reserves the right to review, comment, and make independent assessments of all future work relating to this site.
