Baker Environmental, Inc. (Baker) is pleased to submit three copies of the draft Focused Remedial Investigation (RI) Report for Operable Unit No. 17 (Sites 90, 91, and 92) Marine Corps Base (MCB) Camp Lejeune. This report is being submitted in accordance with the schedule identified in the final IP/FP for CTO-0344 Mod 02 dated April 9, 1997. This report was initially scoped as a Phase I Investigation Report; however, due to the findings of the investigation the preparation of a Focused RI Report in support of a No Action Record of Decision (ROD) was recommended by USEPA Region IV.

Copies of this report have been forwarded to the Environmental Management Department (EMD) at MCB Camp Lejeune, the United States Environmental Protection Agency (USEPA) Region IV, North Carolina Department of Health and Natural Resources (NC DEHNR), the Naval Environmental Health Center (NEHC), the Agency for Toxic Substance and Disease Registry (ATSDR), and OHM Corporation as presented in the attached transmittal letters. Restoration Advisory Board (RAB) members have been informed of the availability of this document.

The initial scope of this project was to complete a Phase I investigation and submit a report documenting the findings. Findings from the Phase I investigation were to be used in determining the scope of work to be presented in the final Project Plans. However, the findings of the Phase I investigation were not indicative of any concerns relating to potential risks to human or environmental health. Consequently, USEPA Region IV and NC DEHNR concurred that an additional investigation was not warranted. Baker's intention is to prepare a scope modification so that remaining funds under this CTO can be used to prepare a Proposed Remedial Action Plan (PRAP) and a No Action ROD. The scope modification will not be prepared until the USEPA and NC DEHNR concur that no additional investigation efforts are required at any of the sites.
