Dear Dr. Stehman:

The quarterly monitoring report (April - June 1997) for Operable Unit No. 1 (Sites 24 and 78) is forwarded as the enclosure. This report includes procedures, analytical findings, and subsequent recommendations of the monitoring program for these sites at Marine Corps Base (MCB), Camp Lejeune. Monitoring program activities for these sites were implemented in response to the Record of Decision document signed by MCB, Camp Lejeune on September 15, 1994.

This enclosed document has incorporated the Notice of Non-Significant Changes dated July 31, 1997. These revisions reflect that only pesticide analyses be performed and not volatile organic compounds or metals at Site 24. Moreover, this has been the second consecutive sampling event that has shown a lack of pesticide contamination in groundwater. Assuming similar results are obtained at the end of the third quarterly sampling period, it will be recommended that Site 24 be eliminated from the long-term monitoring program.

Non-significant changes have also been implemented during sampling at Site 78 this quarter. Analyses for oil and grease, total metals, dissolved solids, and suspended solids have been eliminated from the sampling program due to their irrelevance as to the nature of the source contaminant. Additionally, particular supply, recovery, and monitoring wells have also been eliminated from the sampling plan based upon location, lack of contamination, and/or abandonment

The enclosed document has been prepared by Baker Environmental, Inc. and submitted to the Naval Facilities Engineering Command, Atlantic Division; MCB, Camp Lejeune; United States Environmental Protection Agency; and the North Carolina Department of Environment and Natural Resources in Raleigh.
