

Dear Ms. Hall:

On November 26, 2002, the UST Section, Division of Waste Management, Wilmington Regional Office received a Underground Storage Tank Closure Report for the above referenced site. A review of this report shows that soil contamination does not exceed the residential or soil-to-groundwater maximum soil contaminant concentrations established in 15A NCAC 2L .0115(m), whichever are lower. Based on information provided to date, the UST Section classifies the risk posed by the discharge or release as low risk and determines that no further action is required for this incident. This determination shall apply unless the UST Section later determines that the discharge or release poses an unacceptable risk or a potentially unacceptable risk to human health or the environment.

Pursuant to 15A NCAC 2L .0115(e), the USMC has a continuing obligation to notify the UST Section of any changes that it knows of or should know of, that might affect the level of risk assigned to the discharge or release. 
Dear Ms. Hall:

The Division has reviewed the subject report that was submitted to this office on July 25, 2002. The report did not detail what exactly happened with the piping. For example, was the line drained of any product? If so, by what process(es)? Was the line left in place, or removed? If left in place, was the line capped and/or grouted?

Greater detail is needed about the remote fill location. For example, describe the remote fill location. **Was it secured or abandoned so that no oil could be poured into it?** This would also be a good place for a soil sample, if accessible for such. Please respond to this letter by September 1, 2002.
