Dear Ms. Hall:

On February 4, 2002, the UST Section, Division of Waste Management, Wilmington Regional Office received a Limited Site Assessment Report and Request for No Further Action for the above referenced site. A review of this report shows that soil contamination does not exceed the residential or soil-to-groundwater maximum soil contaminant concentrations established in 15A NCAC 2L .0115(m), whichever are lower. Groundwater samples contained detections of trihalomethanes. A March 1, 2004 follow-up sampling event for the previously detected trihalomethanes did not contain compounds above 15A NCAC 2L standards. Based on information provided to date, the UST Section classifies the risk posed by the discharge or release as low risk and determines that no further action is required for this incident. This determination shall apply unless the UST Section later determines that the discharge or release poses an unacceptable risk or a potentially unacceptable risk to human health or the environment.

Pursuant to 15A NCAC 2L .0115(e), the USMC has a continuing obligation to notify the UST Section of any changes that it knows of or should know of, that might affect the level of risk assigned to the discharge or release.
