On February 24, 2003, the Underground Storage Tank (UST) Section, Division of Waste Management (DWM) Wilmington Regional Office received a UST Closure Report for the above-referenced site. A review of the report shows that soil contamination does not exceed the residential or soil-to-groundwater maximum soil contaminant concentrations established in 15A NCAC 2L .0115(m), whichever are lower. Based on information provided to date, the UST Section classifies the risk posed by the discharge or release as low risk and determines that no further action is required for this incident. This determination shall apply unless the UST Section later determines that the discharge or release poses an unacceptable risk or a potentially unacceptable risk to human health or the environment.

This no further action determination only applies to the above-referenced incident and that for any other incidents, the responsible party is expected to continue to address the contamination as required by the applicable rules and in accordance with any previously issued notices.



Dear Mr. Warren:

On December 31, 1998, the Division of Waste Management received a report entitled "Limited Site Assessment" (LSA), for the above referenced site (please note that, although this is the title of the report, the report is not complete as a *Limited Site Assessment Report* in accordance with NCAC 2L .0115 (c)4). According to the LSA report, one soil boring was installed adjacent to the former tank pit area and one monitoring well was installed inside the former tank pit area. Soil and groundwater samples were collected and submitted to a laboratory for appropriate analyses. The analyses indicated that no soil contamination above 10 parts per million (ppm) of total petroleum hydrocarbons (TPH) 3550 or 5030 remains. The report also indicates that no groundwater contamination above the NCAC 2L standards exists. Since there is no evidence of soil or groundwater contamination above action levels, no further action is required at this time.
