Dear Mr. Smith:

The Well Installation and Soil and Groundwater Sampling Event Report received by the Underground Storage Tank (UST) Section, Wilmington Regional Office on October 11, 2005 has been reviewed. The review indicates that after tank closure or soil excavation soil contamination does not exceed the regulatory action levels for Total Petroleum Hydrocarbons, and groundwater contamination was below 15A NCAC 2L standards.

The UST Section determines that no further action is warranted for this incident. This determination shall apply unless the UST Section later finds that the discharge or release poses an unacceptable risk or a potentially unacceptable risk to human health or the environment. Pursuant to Title 15A NCAC 2L .0115(e) you have a continuing obligation to notify the Department of any changes that might affect the risk or land use classifications that have been assigned.

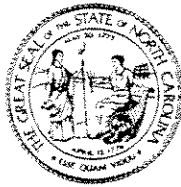
This No Further Action determination applies only to the subject incident; for any other incidents at the subject site, the responsible party must continue to address contamination as required.

**Subject: REVIEW OF TANK CLOSURE SITE ASSESSMENT
AT UNDERGROUND STORAGE TANK SITE
BLDG 901**

Dear Mr. Warren:

The Division of Water Quality (DWQ) is currently in receipt of a report for the above referenced facility entitled, "Initial Site Assessment Report UST Closure by Removal". According to this report, soil samples collected during tank removal activities were analyzed for heavy fuels (oil and grease) using EPA method 9071 and Toxicity Characteristic Leaching Procedure (TCLP). The respective soil analyses indicated heavy fuel contamination of 789 parts per million (ppm) and Selenium levels of 20.2 ppm. Based on these results 49.02 tons of soil was reportedly excavated and additional samples collected at the base of the excavation. These samples indicated heavy fuel contamination <100 ppm and all TCLP metals were less than the maximum allowable concentrations. Based on these results no further action is required by this office at this time.
