Dear Mr. Raines:

Thank you for submitting the subject report to this office on February 23, 1999. The Division has reviewed the report and has the following comment:

1. The report does not demonstrate that soil contamination has been cleaned-up to regulatory action levels. This is documented by the fact that soil at the PW-1 location previously contained 490 mg/kg of TPH-diesel. Please resample the soil from this location and the other three sides of the former tank basin, just outside the limits of the excavation for EPA Methods 5030 and 3550. These soil samples should be obtained from just above the capillary fringe area of the subsurface. You may also want to consider obtaining duplicate soil samples from these same locations for analysis by the new risk-based rule test methods. Although the new test methods are not required for this incident, they may prove to be beneficial for incident closure if TPH values exceed regulatory action levels.
