Thank you for submitting the subject report to the Division on March 26, 2003. The Division has reviewed the report and offers the following comments:

The recommendations in the report are not acceptable to the Division. The Division understands that the USMC does not want to abandon the on site water supply well, therefore the incident can not be closed at this time.

On May 2, 2003, it was recommended that the USMC immediately begin a quarterly monitoring program at the site. Sampling of the water supply well must be included into this program. The first monitoring report is due on July 31, 2004.
