Dear Mr. Smith:

The Annual Groundwater Monitoring Report received by the UST Section, Wilmington Regional Office on June 30, 2006 has been reviewed. The risk posed by the discharge or release at the subject site is reclassified by the Department as low, as stipulated under Title 15A NCAC 2L .0406. The land use at the site is classified as industrial/commercial. Title 15A NCAC 2L .0407(a) requires the USMC to notify the Department of any changes that might affect the risk or land use classifications that have been assigned.

Title 15A NCAC 2L .0407(d) requires the USMC to comply with soil assessment and cleanup requirements of Title 15A NCAC 2L .0408.

A Soil Cleanup Plan (SCP) prepared in accordance with these requirements and the most recent version of the *UST Section Guidelines for Assessment and Corrective Action* which proposes a plan and a schedule for the remediation of soil to the industrial commercial MSCCs must be received by this office within 60 days of the date of this letter. If the SCP proposes to cleanup soil to or leave in-place soil at concentration levels which exceed the lower of the soil-to-groundwater or residential Maximum Soil Contaminant Concentrations (MSCCs) established in Title 15A NCAC 2L .0411, the USMC must give public notice in accordance with 15A NCAC 2L .0409(a) concurrent with the submittal of the SCP.

Failure to comply with the State's rules in the manner and time specified, may result in the assessment of civil penalties and /or the use of other enforcement mechanisms.


