Dear Mr. Smith:

The Annual Monitoring Report/ Site Closure Request received by the Underground Storage Tank (UST) Section, Wilmington Regional Office on June 30, 2006 has been reviewed. The review indicates that soil contamination does not exceed the residential maximum soil contaminant concentrations (MSCCs), established in Title 15A NCAC 2L .0411 and that groundwater contamination does not exceed the groundwater quality standards established in Title 15A NCAC 2L .0202.

The UST Section determines that no further action is warranted for this incident. This determination shall apply unless the UST Section later finds that the discharge or release poses an unacceptable risk or a potentially unacceptable risk to human health or the environment. Pursuant to Title 15A NCAC 2L .0407(a) the USMC has a continuing obligation to notify the Department of any changes that might affect the risk or land use classifications that have been assigned.

Dear Mr. Brewer:

Information received by this office on November 9, 2004 confirms a release or discharge from a petroleum underground storage tank (UST) system at the above-referenced location. Records indicate that the United States Marine Corps is the owner or operator of this UST system. This letter explains the violation(s) and associated corrective action(s) the United States Marine Corps must take as a result of the release or discharge in accordance with North Carolina statutes and rules. The Division of Waste Management, UST Section administers the state's rules for USTs and the required response for petroleum releases. Those rules are located in Title 15A, Subchapter 2L and Title 15A, Subchapter 2N of the North Carolina Administrative Code (NCAC).

VIOLATION 1:

Failure to submit a Limited Site Assessment Report in accordance with Title 15A NCAC 2L .0115(c)(4) to the UST Section within 120 days of discovery of a discharge or a release.

REQUIRED CORRECTIVE ACTION:

Please submit a Limited Site Assessment Report in accordance with Title 15A NCAC 2L .0115(c)(4), containing information needed by the Department to classify the level of risk to human health and the

residential or industrial/commercial. You will be notified of the risk and land use classifications once review of the Limited Site Assessment Report is completed.

Please take the corrective action(s) for the above violation(s) as necessary to bring the site into compliance. Corrective actions must be taken and reported to the Wilmington Regional Office, within 30 days from the date of this notice, unless otherwise noted in the above corrective actions, to avoid recommendation of civil penalties for continuing violations.

Penalties may be assessed for the violation(s) described within this Notice of Violation. Your prompt attention to the items described herein is required. Failure to comply with the State's rules, in the manner and time specified, may result in the assessment of additional civil penalties and/or the use of other enforcement mechanisms available to the State. Each day that a violation continues may be considered a separate violation.

Please note that performing assessment and cleanup work that is not required under 15A NCAC 2L .0115 is not reimbursable from the Commercial or Noncommercial Leaking Petroleum Underground Storage Tank Cleanup Funds.

Dear Mr. Reed:

Enclosed is the Michael Street Fuel Farm Tank Closure Report. This system was removed in September 2004. Confirmation soil and groundwater samples were taken during closure on September 17-22, 2004 and October 10, 2004, respectively. Lab reports dated October 2 and November 11, 2004 confirmed a release in excess of allowable limits.

Based upon receipt of the final lab reports in November, we initiated fieldwork to conduct the follow-on site assessment, and this fieldwork is scheduled for March 2005. Camp Lejeune expects to submit the Limited Site Assessment report for this site to your office by July 1, 2005; therefore, Camp Lejeune respectfully requests an extension until that time.

Award of the assessment was delayed because this site is not funded via our usual sources, which are the Base or Environmental Restoration, Navy funds. Funding from the Defense Energy Support Center (DESC) was only recently received. In addition, our usual assessment contract vehicle is also temporarily unavailable.

Even with these obstacles, the assessment is now funded and scheduled as discussed above. As always, we appreciate your understanding in these matters and we will get the information to you as quickly as possible. 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
Since soil contamination exceeds the lower of the soil-to-groundwater or residential MSCCs, public notice in accordance with 15A NCAC 2L .0409(b) is required. Thus, within 30 days of receipt of this letter, a copy of the letter must be provided by certified mail, or by posting in a prominent place, if certified mail is impractical, to the local health director, the chief administrative officer of each political jurisdiction in which the contamination occurs, all property owners and occupants within or contiguous to the area containing contamination, and all property owners and occupants within or contiguous to the area where the contamination is expected to migrate. Within 60 days of receiving this no further action letter, this office must be provided with proof of receipt of the copy of the letter or of refusal by the addressee to accept delivery of the copy of the letter or with a description of the manner in which the letter was posted.

This No Further Action determination will not become valid until public notice requirements are completed. Interested parties may examine the Annual Monitoring Report/ Site Closure Request by contacting this regional office and may submit comments on the site to the regional office at the address or telephone number listed below.

This No Further Action determination applies only to the subject incident; for any other incidents at the subject site, the responsible party must continue to address contamination as required.
