Dear Ms. Hall:


On January 26, 1999, the Underground Storage Tank (UST) Section, Division of Waste Management (DWM) Wilmington Regional Office received a Limited Site Assessment Addendum for the above-referenced site. A review of the report and the other reports in the file shows that soil contamination does not exceed the residential or soil-to-groundwater maximum soil contaminant concentrations established in 15A NCAC 2L .0115(m), whichever are lower. Based on information provided to date, the UST Section classifies the risk posed by the discharge or release as low risk and determines that no further action is required for this incident. This determination shall apply unless the UST Section later determines that the discharge or release poses an unacceptable risk or a potentially unacceptable risk to human health or the environment.

Dear Mr. Raines:

On December 31, 1997, I received a report entitled "Limited Site Assessment" for the above referenced site. In order to more precisely evaluate the extent of the soil and dissolved groundwater contamination at the site, please conduct the following additional work:

- Collect a groundwater sample from the former tank pit area. The sample should be analyzed using the Massachusetts Department of Environmental Protection (MADEP) methods for volatile petroleum hydrocarbons (VPH) and extractable petroleum hydrocarbons (EPH).
- Collect a native soil sample from the former tank pit area. The sample should be analyzed using EPA methods 8270 (semi-volatile range organics) and 8080 (pesticides/PCBs), and MADEP methods for VPH and EPH.
- Please conduct an irrigation well survey within 250 feet of the site.

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
