Dear Ms. Arnold:

On September 10, 2007, the UST Section received a copy of the subject report in which water samples were collected from 10 locations around the subject site. Some of the samples analyzed had low concentrations of petroleum and solvents. The solvents are thought to be associated with the former ABC One-Hour Cleaners incident. It is recommended that the Base inform the NC Superfund Section about the solvent detections.

Through conversation with Mr. Scott Williams of the Base EMD office, it was learned that no site conditions have changed which would change the risk of the UST incident at Building TT-60. As you are aware, the subject UST incident was formally closed on August 4, 1998. Given this information, there is no need to re-open the subject incident. The Division suggests that you document the petroleum contamination found in the groundwater in the Base Master Plan, and it would be advisable to submit a Notice of Residual Petroleum for this incident since the site was not previously closed under the risk based rule (15A NCAC 2L .0400).

Dear Mr. Warren:

On December 31, 1998, the Division of Waste Management received a report entitled "Limited Site Assessment" for the above referenced site (please note that this is the title of the report but the report is not complete as a *Limited Site Assessment Report* in accordance with NCAC 2L .0115 (c)4). According to the report, the total petroleum hydrocarbon (TPH) levels as analyzed in the soil samples collected during the installation of a monitoring well were below action levels. The report also indicated that the groundwater sample, which was collected and submitted for laboratory analyses, contained no constituents in excess of the 15A NCAC 2L action levels. Since there is no evidence of soil or groundwater contamination above action levels, no further action is required at this time.
