

Determining a Nexus

Reasoning

- Must weigh the probative evidence
- Medical facts in the case for and against a nexus
- Support in the medical literature or other references for and against a nexus
- Thought process is important
- Why you put more weight on some evidence than another
- If you disagree with a previously rendered opinion explain why



The Medical Opinion

Conclusion:

- by the stated event/ exposure/ stressor while on active duty It is more than likely that the claimed condition was caused
- It is at least as likely as not (equipoise) that the claimed stressor while on active duty condition was caused by the stated event/ exposure/
- It is unlikely that the claimed condition was caused by the stated event/ exposure/ stressor while on active duty.
- Do not have to state what you believe caused the claimed condition
- "Cannot opine without resorting to speculation"



Process for Providing Medical Opinions for Camp Lejeune Claims

- All claims related to contaminated water at Camp Office: Lejeune are managed through the Louisville regional
- After claims development by VARO, a medical opinion, if needed will be routed through one of two mechanisms:
