The North Carolina Superfund Section has received and reviewed the Revised Interim Action Proposed Plan for the Shallow Aquifer at the Hadnot Point Industrial Area (HPIA), which was included as an appendix to Michelle Glenn's letter to Laurie Boucher of 27 January 1992. Our comments on the Revised Interim Action Proposed Plan are as follows:

1. On pages 4 and 5, reference is made to two plumes of contamination in the shallow aquifer within the HPIA site. As discussed in our Remedial Investigation and Focused Feasibility Study comment letter of 31 December 1991, there appear to be at least four groundwater lead contamination plumes, in addition to the two fuel/solvent plumes, within the HPIA site. If these lead groundwater contamination plumes are to be addressed as part of subsequent complete and final remedial actions at the site, then this should be specified in the Interim Action Proposed Plan.

2. In the discussion of Alternative 2 on page 6 and the discussion of Alternatives 2 and 5 on page 9, the Hadnot Point Sewage Treatment Plant (STP) is referred to as being "on-site". This STP is not actually located within the area defined as the HPIA site and, therefore, should not be referred to as being "on-site" or "on-site treatment".
3. In the "Summary of the Preferred Alternative" discussion on page 10, the Preferred Alternative should be clearly identified in the opening paragraph as Alternative 2.
