**Comments concerning the Proposed Remedial Action Plan, Operable Unit 8 (Site 16), MCB
Camp Lejeune, North Carolina.**

1. Page 2, para 2 - Include information from the Site Management Plan such as "Site 16 was opened about 1958 and was closed in 1972" and "Records indicate a small amount of oil disposal is suspected. Asbestos material dumped on the surface has been removed from this 4-acre site."

2. Page 7, para 6 - Add this address to the Public Comment Period section:

3. Table 1 - In the title block of the last column, the word "locaion" should be changed to "location".

4. Table 1 - It would be easier to follow some of the risk based decisions if the Risk Based Concentrations (RBC) were included in this table. Since these RBC's are used as comparison data, it seems appropriate to have these values included in this table.
