Baker Environmental, Inc. (Baker) is pleased to submit this Letter Report which documents the findings of the post-Remedial Investigation (RI) field investigations conducted at Marine Corp Base (MCB), Camp Lejeune, North Carolina; OU No. 6 (Sites 36, 54, and 86). The post-RI field investigations were conducted in July through September of this year, following the agreed course of action for CTO 0303 discussed at the May 28, 1997 meeting held at the Wilmington Regional Office of the North Carolina Department of Environment and Natural Resources (NCDENR).

Based upon the convenience of having the majority of the MCB, Camp Lejeune Partnering Team together at the November 19, 1997 meeting; it is our desire to briefly discuss (via a conference call) the findings of the post-RI groundwater investigations for Sites 36, 54, and 86. In addition, the timeliness of this meeting will allow the majority of the team the opportunity to reevaluate the information provided in the Draft Final Feasibility Study (FS) reports, which were submitted on April 30, 1997.



Based upon the outcome of the additional field investigation, comments related to the Draft Final FS report have not been formally received. It is our intention that this Letter Report, along with the Draft Final FS report, can be reviewed and comments generated within the next 30 days. With receipt of comments on or about December 15, 1997, Baker anticipates formal Response to Comments and submittal of the Final FS report on or about January 5, 1998. Although these dates are relative to the Partnering Team's schedules, this would allow for the completion of the Final Proposed Remedial Action Plan, Public Meeting, and Record of Decision for OU No. 6 in the early spring of 1998.
