Congress passed the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act (RCRA) back in the late 1970's. This Act is our nation's hazardous waste management program. Part of this program involves the identification, assessment and cleanup of past hazardous waste disposal sites.

In 1986 the Superfund Amendments and Reauthorization Act (SARA) passed by Congress made major changes to RCRA and set requirements for Department of Defense cleanup of past hazardous waste disposal sites on military bases.
